At the SLAV conference on Friday May 16 at the State Library of Victoria, the new [SLAV website](#) was launched. While we were all quite attached to the endearing owl that flashed on the screen of the old SLAV website, we had recognised that it was time to update the technology. The website needed an increase in functionality so that it was platform neutral and more easily accessible. To reach the stage of being able to launch the website, there have been many months of meetings to discuss the needs of SLAV, plan for the redevelopment, formulate a brief, put the brief out to tender, appoint a developer, work through the design and subsequent issues, and populate the site.

Reflecting the digital environment today, the website that was launched at the conference is a website that continues to be under development. It is evolving, responsive, dynamic, and reflective of SLAVs current and future needs.
